- **Complete online application** (\$50 fee).
NSU Computing Graduate International Application
- Meet **application deadline(s)**.
Fall July 21
Winter December 1
- **Minimum GPA** required: 2.5
(see specific requirements on the website).
- Applicants must have a **bachelor's degree** from a regionally accredited U.S. institution or an equivalent degree for international applicants.
- Submit **official transcripts** from all colleges and universities previously attended (including transcript evaluations from NACES-accredited organizations).
- Submit **English proficiency test score(s)**.

Deadline to submit documents for Fall I-20 is August 1, 2024.
