Residence Halls

First year students have guaranteed housing and are required to live on campus for their first two years, with exceptions following a review. Most halls are "suite-style" with a bathroom connecting two separate rooms (mostly doubles). Amenities include study lounges, network access and laundry facilities. Dedicated graduate and upper class housing is available in apartment-style housing with two double rooms, living room/kitchen area and bathroom. Students living on campus are required to purchase a meal plan except those living in apartments.

Deposits | \$125 non-refundable deposit is required for first-time, first year students in order to provide a schedule for these students. Deposits are not required for the I-20 to be issued. Non-refundable housing deposit is \$150.

I-20 Bank Statement amounts | Students may deduct awarded scholarships and submit statement showing net amount. Deposit is not required for I-20 to be issued. Turnaround time is usually 3-5 business days for an I-20, but could be longer during peak processing times.
