Housing

First-year students will live in one of three residence halls: Saxton, Wilder, or Holmes. Each hall features single or double rooms in a traditional corridor-style building (Saxton also features triple rooms). Each hall is equipped with a kitchen, and study and tv lounges are available. Upper class students will enjoy independent living in Hartwick's Day Apartment community where two-bedroom and four-bedroom apartments are available. Each apartment features a kitchen and living room area along with one shared bathroom in the two-bedroom apartment and two shared bathrooms in the four-bedroom apartment. Students will have their own bedroom in each apartment setting.

Student Organizations & Clubs

At Hartwick, events and organizations are designed to provide students with opportunities for leadership and engagement. Students can choose to join any of Hartwick's 60+ student clubs or explore the fraternity or sorority community. Students can get involved in on- or off-campus community service opportunities. There is a fee of \$100 to obtain an I-20 at Hartwick (fee is waived for students from Vietnam).

After students receive their visa, they are required to pay the tuition deposit of \$400.
